"Abraham believed in God and it was reckoned to him as righteousness."

Dear friends,

The name of Abraham is used by Paul more frequently than any other person except Jesus. For Paul, Abraham epitomized the essence of faith. Abraham trusted God before there was scripture to fall back on; laws that told us what to do; there were no traditions of faith to find comfort; nor was there a supportive community to hold us and pray for us. According to scripture, Abraham trusted God before God performed any acts for Abraham to experience.

Go back and read Genesis 12:1-4a, our introduction to this remarkable man. Abraham's first encounter with God was when God told him to go from everything he knew to a new land; God would tell him when he go there. And Abraham said, "Okay." Abraham's relationship with God was founded on trust in God's promise.

This is where Paul saw the essence of faith. The first act between God and Abraham was not based on something that was done by God or by Abraham, but on trust. "Abraham believed God and it was reckoned to him as righteousness." Paul went on to build his case for the inclusion of the Gentiles as God's people by showing that this right relationship between God and Abraham preceded God's giving the commandments to Moses on Mount Sinai. Building on the promise in Genesis 17 that God would make Abraham the father of many nations, Paul concluded that all humanity was included in God's promise.

We are all heirs of a promise made before anyone had done anything to earn it. In the weeks and months ahead, as we try to figure out what God has in store for us, maybe we should try to be as trusting as Abraham. Who knows where God's grace might lead us?

#### Ukraine Update from the Mission Committee

Our church's \$1,024 collection last year for Presbyterian Disaster Assistance Ukraine refugee efforts, which was matched by the Synod of the Trinity, added to over \$8 million to support the people of Ukraine. Thanks to the generosity of Presbyterians, the church has been able to support longer-term housing, psycho-social and integration services for Ukrainian refugees in Hungary, Romania, Czech Republic and Poland. It also supports ongoing humanitarian aid efforts inside Ukraine, as well as the future rebuilding and reintegration when the war comes to an end and it is safe for people to return.
