As I turned on the television this morning to listen while exercising, I was stunned by the news of the ship "Dali" collision into the Francis Scott Key Bridge in Baltimore. Our hearts and prayers go out to those affected by this incredibly serious event. Lives have been affected – some in a very large, profound way. Others will only be inconvenienced by their increased travel time. Whatever the impact, it affects all of our lives; even if in a very small way.

Then, because of the religious impact of this week, I was reminded of the actions of our Lord Jesus Christ – and those of the Jewish leaders of his time along with the Roman Empire – on the entire world. What a huge impact they all had. Many say that the events of this week, almost 2000 years ago, had the single most significant impact on the world in human history.

We humans are often proud of ourselves for what we accomplish: building a successful career, education achieved, physical goals accomplished, constructing our houses, even building bridges and tunnels. But, compared to what Jesus accomplished in His short human life and sacrifice on the cross of Calvary, our accomplishments are fleeting. They are finite; and will most likely be soon forgotten.

On that fateful Good Friday, Jesus changed lives forever. None of us (2000 years later) are the same as we would have been without Jesus. Even those who are not our brothers and sisters in faith are affected. Whether they would admit it, or not, our Jewish, Muslim, Buddhist, Hindu, etc. friends have been affected. The WHOLE world changed on that first Good Friday.



But, more importantly, it changed on that Sunday morning. Jesus arose from the tomb to prove that He was/is, in fact, God incarnate. He proved to the world that even death can not prevent God from loving us. His was one of the cruelest deaths imaginable. Yet, Jesus forgave those who were killing Him. He continued to love them; and to this day loves us all, no matter our condition or circumstance.

As we finish out this Holy Week, and enter into the Easter season, let's continually be reminded of Jesus' love for us. Let us remind each other, and those with whom we come into contact, that God loves us, and we are to likewise love others.




